- Gift staff with <u>women owned food and beverage</u> <u>products</u>.
- New! Plan <u>activities</u> to celebrate the annual International Women's Day which takes place on March 8th.



Chapters

In addition to the tools and resources listed above, chapters can take further action celebrating Black History Month at the chapter level:

- Share ANFP's social media posts and tell members to share a story or photo about an important woman in their lives.
- Host a virtual event to discuss equality. Use a <u>TED</u>
 <u>Talk</u> to get the discussion started.
- Invite women from different generations, backgrounds, races, ethnicities, educational levels, etc. to share their stories during a virtual storytelling session.
- Host an all-women panel either in-person or virtually inviting guest speakers from all areas of the foodservice industry (healthcare, corrections, schools, etc.) to speak on their experiences.
- Start a book club with books authored by women.
- Encourage members to wear purple (the official color of Women's History Month) on a specific day and post their photos on your chapter's social media page or include it in your newsletter.
