Bottom Line Impact in CDM, CFPP-Led Operations:

- Facilities with a CDM, CFPP show significantly less turnover. The **turnover rate at facilities with a CDM, CFPP is 23% lower** than facilities without a CDM, CFPP.
- Skilled nursing facilities with a CDM, CFPP had an average **19% fewer Nutrition & Foodservice related tags** on inspection compared to facilities without a CDM, CFPP.
- CDM, CFPPs are **more likely to use improved patient outcomes** as a measure of success. The percentage of CDM, CFPPs using this measure of success is 44% higher than non-CDM, CFPPs.
- The average star rating of **facilities with a CDM, CFPP was 9% higher** than those without a CDM, CFPP.
