

To maintain the Certified Dietary Manager, Certified Food Protection Professional (CDM, CFPP) credential, you must pay the annual certification renewal fee as well as earn and report a minimum of 45 hours of eligible continuing education (CE) every three years, including nine CE hours in Sanitation and Safety and, effective June 1, 2019, one CE hour pertaining to Professional Ethics. Effective June 1, 2019, to submit a CE activity, all required documentation must be submitted.

Please Note

CDM's who were scheduled to recertify on May 31, 2020, were given an extension due to COVID-19 automatically... but should expect to be audited this May 2021. Please review your CE's just in case you need to update your hours prior to May 31st, 2021 There are Free CE's available in the ANFP Marketplace and through Star-Kist Tuna.
