Felix Jones:

Felix, Past President of Georgia-ANFP, has over 35 years in the Food Service Industry. He became a CDM-CFPP in 2018 and has been a Servsafe Proctor for over 10 years. Felix is active at the National Level of ANFP and serves on the Chapter Leadership Team (CLT).

Elected as President-Elect in 2020, he became the Chapter's President in 2022, serving for three years. He won the Prestigious Diamond Award 2023 for Georgia-ANFP and helped start the CDM recognition project in Georgia.

Felix is committed to family and community, serving with various organizations, booster clubs, domestic violence awareness programs, and as Chair for the Board of Elections in his county. Felix will receive the CDM Volunteer of the Year award 2025 at ACE in Minnesota.
