

The Ethiopian cabbage dish is gluten-free and naturally vegan, but some even add niter kibbeh, a spiced clarified butter, for extra flavor.

Ingredients:

½ cup olive oil
4 carrots, thinly sliced
1 onion, thinly sliced
1 tsp sea salt
½ tsp ground black pepper
½ tsp ground cumin
½ tsp ground turmeric

Directions

Heat the olive oil in skillet over medium heat. Cook the carrots and onions in the hot oil for about 5 minutes. Stir in the salt, pepper, cumin, turmeric, and cabbage and cook another 15 to 20 minutes. Add potatoes. Cover. Reduce heat to medium-low and cook until potatoes are soft, 20 to 30 minutes.
