My Recipe for Success By Thomas Thaman, CDM, CFPP



On February 18, I officially retired from my position of Director of Food and Nutrition of Eskenazi Health after 18 years as Director and 45 years in Foodservice. While I retired from Eskenazi, I am looking forward to my next journey wherever that leads me and I am going to continue my work with both Indiana and National ANFP. I am especially grateful to the exceptional leadership team we developed and it allowed us to reach heights we never dreamed possible. Last year, I was asked to reflect back on my professional journey and develop my top 10 core philosophies for Edge Magazine. I was really proud of this list and I shared at the Regional Meeting in Toledo in

September. I would like to share it with the Indiana ANFP CDM's and hope you can relate to these philosophies to your own career success.

- 1. **Surround yourself with top talent**: the key to being successful is now how much you know but how much your team knows. Look for individuals who bring a varied skill set to your team.
- 2. **Not everything goes as planned**, always have an alternate plan A or plan B. This allows you flexibility and still be able to achieve your overall goals.
- 3. **Stay focused on what you can control.** Stay inside your lane and don't interfere with issues outside your scope of control.
- 4. **Don't underestimate the value of volunteerism**. It can be a welcome respite from the stress of your job and give you an astonishing view of your profession and the world around you.
- 5. Trust your instincts. If you are uncomfortable about a decision your first instinct is probably correct.
- 6. **Raise the bar every year.** Whether it is yourself or your team, reach for more. It will prevent stagnation and promote growth
- 7. **Learn from your mistakes**. There is nothing wrong with being self reflective when something goes wrong,. As yourself where you went wrong and how to prevent making the same mistake twice
- 8. **Embrace Feedback**. Feedback is a very necessary component to continually improve your goals and strategies. Feedback allows you an opportunity to get an opinion through a different lens.
- 9. **Sleep on It.** Difficult decisions can sometime be easier if you give it more time to weigh both pros and cons of a decision. After emotions die down, you may have a different perspective and change your course of action.
- 10. **The key to success is an engaged staff**. Make sure the workplace you are managing is a satisfying and rewarding experience. It happens through focused employee engagement and changes the culture of you department.


Volunteer Spotlight by Tom Thaman Meet Javier Gasnarez, CDM, CFPP



If you are able to attend one of Indiana ANFP's State Spring or Fall Meeting, you might have met Javier Gasarez, CDM, CFPP. Javier is currently the Culinary Director and Executive Chef at Sage Bluff in Fort Wayne, a Saber Health community.

Born and raised in Fort Wayne, Javier's first job and where he got his start in foodservice was at Azar's Big Boy where, like many of us started washing dishes while in high school and one day the cook called in and Javier was asked to assist the manager in the kitchen as a cook and has been in the kitchen every since.
