Essenhaus Inn and Conference Center is located 420 US 20 slightly east of Middlebury and is easily accessible from the Indiana Turnpike, I-69 and SR 37. Dominick is the Assistant Vice-President of Culinary Services for Trilogy Health Services and helps with overseeing Trilogy's culinary operations in Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, Wisconsin and Michigan. Trilogy's home office is based out of Louisville, Kentucky. We are also pleased to report that Dominick has been selected as our Indiana ANFP—President Elect starting June 1, 2025, and will be an important voice for our chapter for the next few years.

Dominick started cooking in high school and realized he had a passion for it. After high school, he enrolled at Le Cordon Bleu in Chicago to become a trained chef where he graduated with an Associate Degree in Culinary Arts. Dominick wanted to focus on quality food production with a work life balance and chose to come to healthcare. For the last 15 years, he has worked for Trilogy Health Services, whose focus is on food and provides healthy nutritious meals for their residents. Dominick decided to become a CDM, CFPP, to enhance his career path, as well as learn more about the clinical side of what CDM's are responsible for. Dominick got that training from the University of North Dakota precertification course.

Dominick does not have one specific person as a mentor in this profession but does have many

This is a program that promotes scratch base cooking and uses healthy ingredients and features food in its natural state. Doing this helps provide residents with nourishing meals while still maintaining general acceptability which can be a fine line to balance.

Showcase Your Facility and Team Members by Hosting an Indiana ANFP Meeting

When members host their facility, it really helps Indiana ANFP by minimizing costs of expensive hotels and or conference centers.

One day meetings area a great way for our members to network and earn 5 or 6 CE's at a live meeting which accommodates their own very busy schedule

To host a meeting, there is some basic requirements that the organization would require

- A meeting room or community space that can accommodate at least 40 members classroom or round table seating with public men/women restrooms available.
- Recommendations of nearby hotels for members to stay at if coming from a distance. For one day meetings we do not have a host hotel but do provide the contact information.
- Audio Visual assistance to include a video projector and screen. If these are not available, a recommendation for a local audio visual vendor would be ideal. Speaker and



microphone would be preferred

- Ample Parking in an onsite or adjacent lot to accommodate at least 25 cars.
- A catered meal supplied by the facility team.
 IN ANFP will cover the cost of the lunch at a suggested nominal price at around \$10.00 per attendee.
- Assistance in program planning by inviting any of the facilities administrative team to speak including the Administrator, HR leader, Dietitian or a Nursing Leader. This is strictly optional but always appreciated
- A brief welcome by the Administrator of the Facility at the beginning of the day makes for a very positive experience
