To reflect additional documentation and proof of attendance that is now required by the Certifying Board of Dietary Managers, we are doing the certificate process different this year.

- Attendees will be checked out at the end of each session to ensure they attended the

 attendees leave each session. A few reminders regarding this new process:

 - ✓ Enroll and no show... then you weren't there.
 - ✓ Leave after 15 minutes... then you won't get credit for the full session.
