# Tips for Celebrating Pride in Food Service Week

#### For the Staff

- Decorate the dining area(s) with place mats, balloons, and streamers.
- Recognize the Dietary Staff. Spotlight food service workers on the bulletin board with pictures and information about their contribution in the dietary department. Give appreciation gifts.
- Involve the entire facility. Goodies for everyone!
- Make the Week an Educational Event. Have a dietary trivia contest, produce a mini dietary newsletter, offer cholesterol testing.
- Publicize celebration plans. Indicate on the menu that it's Pride in Food Service Week.
- Invite suppliers to participate. Ask longstanding suppliers to sponsor the event(s) by helping to fund the
  activities.
- Put current pictures of dietary staff on bulletin board on one side and baby pictures on the other and have a
  contest to see who can identify the most.
- Have a Pureed Food contest for staff to guess what it is and have a free dinner at a local restaurant as the
  prize.
- Present flowers, mugs, or other small gift items to food service staff at a special luncheon acknowledging them.
- Treat the food service staff to a dinner at a local restaurant and present them with your facilities' sweatshirt/golf shirt with the food service logo.
- Play a special bingo game using associates' names; gives prizes donated by vendors.

#### **Show Your Pride to Your Community**

- Bring in a local congressman/woman to address certification in your state.
- Have a salad bar, serve pizza, and make-your-own sundae event.
- Conduct a food pantry collection during the week and offer a prize to the department bringing in the most items.
- Have a "Make-A-Sub" lunch, with fixings for sub sandwiches, fresh fruit and dessert.
- Take a survey of your residents/patients to determine favorite foods and cook them during Pride in Food Service Week. One facility cooked a turkey dinner!
- Sponsor a Poster Contest. If your facility serves young people, encourage them to illustrate some aspect of nutrition awareness.
- Publish a "Healthy Fare" newsletter that highlights recipes and nutrition Web sites; serve popcorn in the dining room for a snack.
