





FOR YOUR INFORMATION

KNOCKOUT BACTERIA by STORING FOOD CORRECTLY

UPON DELIVERY cold and frozen foods should be stored first

MEATS, specifically fresh meats should be placed in plastic containers on the lower shelves of refrigerator or cooler

EGGS should be stored on lower shelves or have a specific area of your refrigerator/cooler designated for these; they are not stored above other foods

MILK is stored in the center or toward back of coolers—NEVER by the door. Opening of the door allows the milk to warm. The warming and cooling causes spoilage in a shorter period of time.

ALUMINUM FOIL OR PAPER is not placed on shelves of refrigerators/coolers; this prevents cool air circulating to other shelves.

CARDBOARD IS AN INSULATOR. It insulates the food from the cold. (I know many foods are left in the original cases which keeps them together and can be dated more easily. Cardboard is still an insulator).

DO not accept:

- A. boxes with ice crystals
- B. decayed or discolored fruits and vegetables
- C. torn boxes/cases
- D. IQF foods that are frozen together
- E. Slippery or dark colored meats

FOODS with signs of rodent or pest infestation is unacceptable.

HAVE a receiving system.

- A. TRAIN the employee/employees checking in the food
- B. FOLLOW-UP for compliance

WHEN YOU SIGN for the food, YOU ARE SAYING, "this is acceptable".
