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# SC ANFP Scholarships and Memorial Funds

Through the years the SC ANFP has implemented award programs for CDM, CFPPs and students to gain needed funds for course work, testing, conference attendance, and emergency situations. Members of the state chapter and supporters contribute these resources through auctions and donations to help better the lives of people in need within our profession. There are currently four scholarships and memorial funds that you should know about that could help you or someone you know in their time of need.

The Colleen Ham Scholarship Fund – This fund was the first of its kind implemented by SC ANFP to help pay the cost of certification testing for students of the CDM, CFPP course. It is awarded twice a year to applicants that submit an essay and application form prior to taking their CDM, CFPP Certification Exam. The deadline for submission is December 1st and June 1st of each year. If you know a student, please inform them

The Bob Sloan Scholarship Fund – This fund was featured in another article due to its first time award recipient in 2021. It was created to send an active member in good standing to the national ANFP conference annually with the hopes that the experience would further their career development and solidify their dedication to volunteering both on the state and national levels.

The Frances Brown Memorial Fund – The late Frances Brown was a firm believer that education was the key to being a great leader in the Foodservice in-

dustry. This fund was created in her name to provide funds for books, flashcards, and other instructional materials for students currently taking the CDM, CFPP course. It may be awarded up to three times per year not to exceed \$100 per award. If you know a student, please inform them of these resources and contact your chapter leaders.

**The CDM Assistance Fund** – This fund was created in 2017 to help CDM, CFPPs manage the cost of annual recertification dues or registration fees for a state conference.

From time to time things happen within everyone's lives that create a financial hardship – unemployment, natural disaster, death in the immediate family, etc. The membership of the SC ANFP suggested that this fund be created to help in these cases. The monies in the fund are from auctions, fund raisers, and personal donations. SC ANFP members care for one another, and this fund represents the Brother and Sisterhood that we share. The first award from this fund was given in 2020 to pay the annual dues of a member that had been out of work through the pandemic. Thank you members for making this happen!

There are funds for your career journey available to all ANFP members and student members from several sources. If you are in need, contact your local chapter leaders to discuss your situation. 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#### **Bob Sloan Memorial Fund**



Many of you may remember Bob Sloan, CDM, CFPP. He was a mentor to many, a friend to all, and an enemy to none. His devotion to the organization was immense - not only in South Carolina, but also on the national level. The National Chair-Elect was taken from his family and the organization untimely in December of 2010 as he passed peacefully in his sleep from a heart attack.

Shortly thereafter, his wife, Pam, and her children contacted us to initiate a memorial fund to send hopeful state chapter leaders to a national conference. It was Bob's belief that if a person were to attend a national conference that they would be hooked on volunteering for the organization, and that trip would catapult their career.

The fund was created as Pam and family wished. Silent auctions and other fund raisers were held, donations were taken, and the Sloan family donated money to it as well.

For more than ten years this fund lay waiting for an applicant to meet the criteria, and make a submission for its award. That day came in 2021 as a submission was received by Audrey Thomas, CDM, CFPP. The Executive Board reviewed the submission and it was shared with Pam for her approval. The submission was awarded the memorial funds by unanimous vote.

Having been mentored by Bob, I know he would be so proud of who received the funds as Audrey was one of the last people that he began to mentor. I had the honor of spending time with Audrey at the 2021 ACE Conference, and I know it has made a difference in her outlook on volunteering and will make a huge impact on her career going forward. The award was also mentioned in the acceptance speech of the incoming ANFP Board Chair, Omar Humes, in a heartfelt recognition of those that have paved the way for today's leaders of the ANFP.


