#### **Goal Setting:**

Do you have your goals written down for 2024? If you do not then how do you plan to be successful? Goal setting may be tedious and challenging. It is however, very important even for the most seasoned veteran. Just the act of writing them down is progress. If you have department goals then you must share them with your employees. If they do not know what the goals are then how can they help you reach them? There are those that say you shouldn't share personal goals. This is subjective because if you have a close friend who will help keep you accountable then it might be a good thing to have a friendly person help motivate you. #### Goals require a few things:

**Measurable**— they must be measurable, otherwise how will you gauge improvement

And if the goal is not met then you have to reassess and make changes and decide if the current path is the best or if you need to try something different.

There are a lot of different acronyms for goal setting out there. Rather than focus on all the ways people find to remember things. My suggestion is make sure you have all the above written down and "Just Do It!" Action will get you further than talking about it.


















#### What is the most common Food Safety Vioation?


